GOALS

The Bahrain Red Crescent Society aims at realising the humanitarian objectives of the International Red Cross Societies. The International nature of the Society and the humanitarian aims and purposes which it endeavours to achieve, both in Bahrain and abroad, according to the principles of humanitarian co-operation endorsed by the International Geneva Conventions and conforming with the principles of other Red Crescent and Red Cross Societies are as follows :

1. HUMANITARIAN AIMS

The Red Crescent was established to extend indiscriminate help and assistance to soldiers and the injured in the battlefield. The Society is presently pursuing a policy of protection for human life and public health, relief of human suffering and promotion of understanding, friendship and co-operation between all nations.

2. IMPARTIALITY

The Red Crescent Society fulfils its duties without any consideration for nationality, race, religion, social status or political ideology.

3. NEUTRALITY

The Society refrains from taking part in any dispute and does not engage in the discussion of political, racial or ideological topics.

4. INDEPENDENCE

The Red Crescent is an independent organisation. While its national societies work closely with the authorities in their respective countries and abide by their laws, they maintain the independent pursuit of international principles of the Red Crescent and Red Cross Societies.

5. CHARITABLE NATURE

The Red Crescent is a charitable organisation, offering voluntary help and relief when needed without seeking any financial reward.

6. UNITY ASPECT

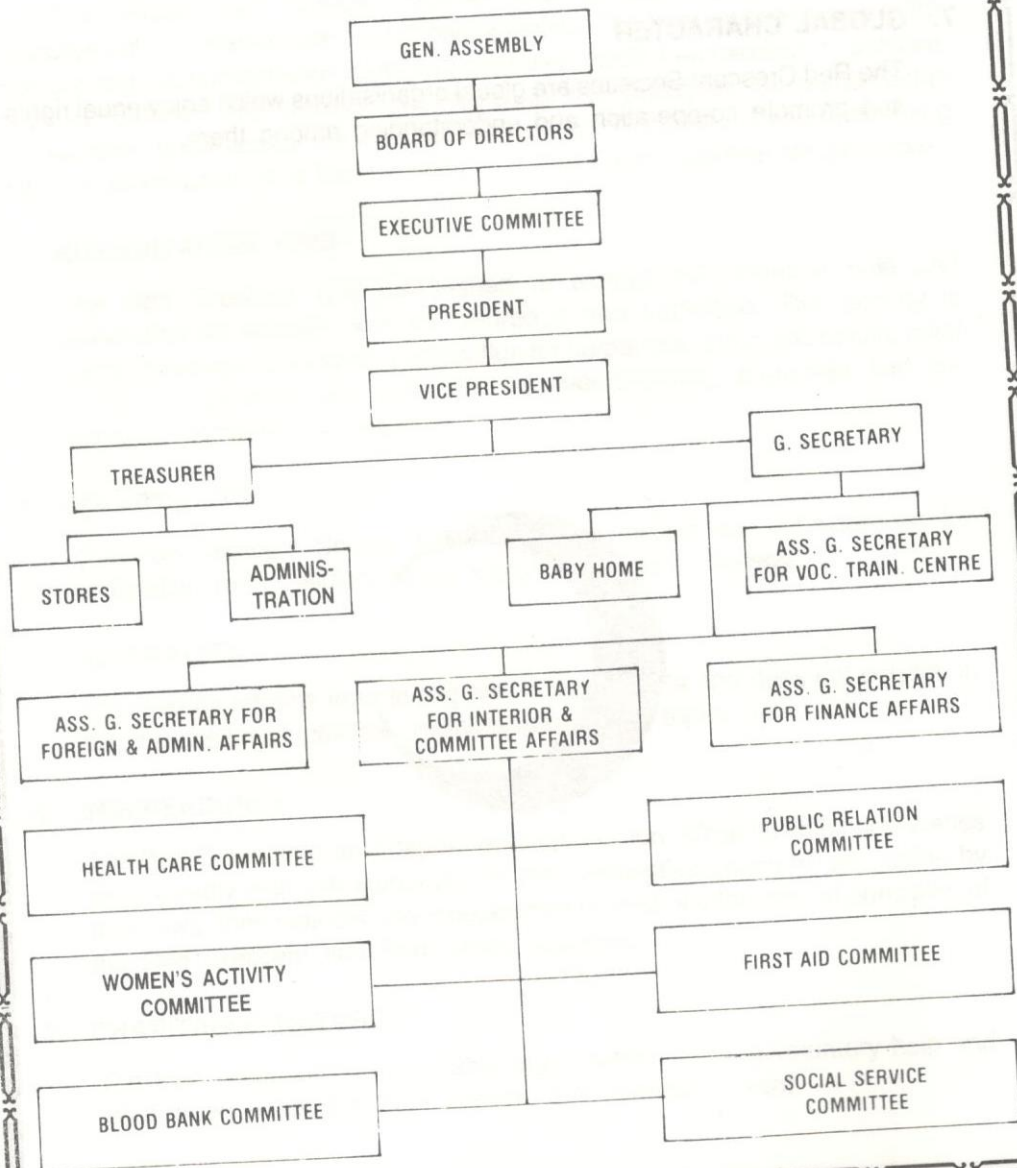
The Red Crescent may not establish more than one organisation in each country and its humanitarian deeds extend to the entire nation.

7. GLOBAL CHARACTER

The Red Crescent Societies are global organisations which enjoy equal rights and promote co-operation and understanding among them.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS' MESSAGE

Monday the 23rd of November, 1987 will be a memorable day in the history of the Bahrain Red Crescent Society. It will continue to be proudly and honorably remembered by this generation of the Society's members and the future generations will recall it every time they set foot in the Society's premises.

This is not because the Society's headquarters are prestigious or because they are a masterpiece of architectural design, but because the completion of the project was a miracle brought about by the members of the Society whose only dream was to complete it in the best possible shape according to the most advanced technical and scientific standards under the supervision of leading consulting firms.

Some would ask : Where is the miracle considering that more prestigious and bigger buildings can be easily constructed. But the case is different, because the Construction Committee set a goal on which it would not retreat : to complete the building without affecting the financial resources the Society has allocated for charitable project, under any circumstances.

The cost of the building was estimated at approximately Bahrain Dinars one million. Despite the astronomical figure, we decided to embark on the project, with God's assistance and help. No sooner had we set out on it, than rescue and relief came to us. H.E. the Prime Minister ordered that an assistance be given to the Society to complete the building by offering it BD.300,000 (Bahrain Dinars three hundred thousand). The plot of land was already donated by H.H. the Amir once he knew that we were planning to build new headquarters for the Society. Since then, donations and contributions have been pouring in until the building work was completed, thanks be to God.

Then came the inauguration day on Monday 23rd November, 1987. We had requested H.H. the Amir is the Honorary President of the Society, to kindly inaugurate the Society's Headquarters, and he set the date of 23rd November, 1987 for this occasion. The Amir was accompanied by H.E. the Prime Minister, Ministers, Senior officials of government departments and companies, traders, and members of the Society.

For this purpose, we held a modest ceremony in which school children and junior cubs recited poems about peace, security, love and the principles of the Red Crescent. The Amir then unveiled the commemorative plaque and inspected the Society's premises. The Amir and the Prime Minister shook hands with all the Society's members and lauded their activities. They spent a considerable time at the Vocational Training Section and they expressed admiration of all they had seen. They paid due attention to all detail that they noticed that the Society's Library lacked the necessary books. Consequently, they issued instructions to H.E. the Minister for Information, Tariq Al Moayyed, to provide the Library with all the books it needed and the Minister carried out these instructions in this regard.

On this occasion, we have to pay tribute to the commendable efforts made by the Minister for Information in completing the building of the Society's headquarters and in helping us raise funds, and we will continue to remember these efforts for ever.

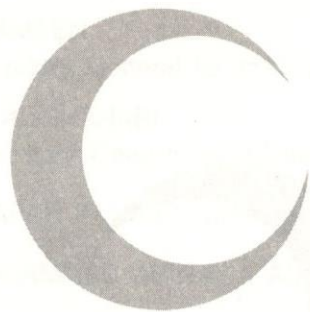

BLOOD BANK COMMITTEE

The Committee continued its efforts during 1987 to realise the following objectives :

1. Using all possible means to urge citizens and residents to donate blood as a unique humanitarian deed to provide the necessary requirements of various blood groups for all those who need them under all circumstances and at all times.
2. Co-ordinating and co-operating with similar societies in the Arab world in particular and in other countries in general for the purpose of improving and upgarding blood transfusion services.
3. Honouring blood donors in conjunction with various private and government institutions.

MAJOR TASKS CARRIED OUT BY THE COMMITTEE DURING 1987

1. Promoting awareness among citizens and residents of the need to donate blood through various mass media, like radio, television and daily Arabic and English newspapers published in Bahrain and through the Committee's publications, like booklets, posters and brochures, etc.
2. The Committee promoted cultural information about blood donation and donors through Radio Bahrain's English Programme and provided T-shirts to be distributed as gifts to the participants in this programme. The news about each donation campaign carried out by the Committee was also broadcast on the radio on time.

3. The Committee succeeded in involving Raido Bahrain, the Arabic Programme (Bahrain this Morning;, in its educational and awareness promotion campaigns, the broadcasting news about blood donation campaigns and making telephone calls live on air with a number of donors.
4. The Committee made intensive efforts to organise blood donation campaigns among youth and worker groups by distributing booklets, brochures and posters for this purpose before setting on each campaign. The results of these campaigns were as follows :

This rise in the number of campaigns and donors was brought about mainly due to the funds spent by the Society in financing these campaigns. New coverage was provided for all these campaigns through the newspapers and radio and some of them were given television coverage.

5. The Committee realised an objective goal which it was seeking since its reorganisation, being the promotion of the idea of free donation (without any material consideration), particularly among groups of young people. The Committee launched two successful campaigns, one of them at Bahrain University and the other at the Arabian Gulf University, upon an initiative from the university students themselves. This was considered by the Committee an outstanding success.
6. During 1987, the number of blood donors at the Central Blood Bank totalled 6,989. The number of blood donors at the BDF Hospital totalled 1,224, and this enabled the Committee to fulfil its plan of providing 20 blood units for every 1,000 population within one year of its intensive efforts to realise this goal. The Committee is even trying to achieve a higher level during the next years in order to cope with the rise in demand for blood transfusion cases.
7. The following Table shows the accomplishments achieved by the Committee by increasing blood units by more than 40 percent compared with 1983 since the Committee was reorganised.

PUBLIC RELATIONS COMMITTEE

1. The Committee organised a visit to Al Areen Wildlife Park on Saturday, 3rd January 1987 for all committees.
2. The Committee furnished the Qatar Red Crescent Society with a number of booklets, annual reports and first aid manuals, Blood Bank activities and insignias for holding an exhibition on the occasion of the 18th meeting of the Arab Crescent and Cross Societies.
3. The Committee distributed a form of all committees to be filled in and returned to update addresses and determine active members in each committee.
4. Mr Mohamed Abdul Rasool Al Khayyat, the Chairman of the Committee, represented the Society at the 18th Conference of Arab Red Crescent and Cross Societies held in Doha, Qatar, from 2nd March 1988.
5. The Committee organised a visit to the Children Welfare Home and presented a number of gifts and toys to the children there to make them happy.
6. The Committee organised a visit to the Ibn Al Nafees Hospital for entertaining patients.
7. Miss Haya Mohamed Al Khayyat and Mr Mohamed Salen Al Thawadi represented the society at the 2nd World Camp for Red Crescent and Cross Societies Youths held in Port Said, Arab Republic of Egypt, between 11th and 21st September 1987.
8. The two members, Lulwa Al Thawadi and Safiyya Abdul Rahman, attended a course in supervising the organisation of libraries at the Directorate of Public Libraries, Ministry of Education.
9. The Committee continued its efforts in recruiting new members of the Society and opened new files for them for the purpose of boosting the Society's voluntary and charitable efforts. The number of new members totalled ().
10. The Committee continued publishing Al Hilal Magazine and published a special issue on the occasion of inaugurating the Society's new Headquarters.

11. The Committee prepared an in-house questionnaire to study and evaluate the Society's activities.
12. The Committee designed decor for the Society's Headquarters and made preparations for the inauguration ceremonies by handing paintings and putting up a board and a cabinet for insignias, etc.
13. The Committee made the necessary preparations and co-ordination for the ceremonies to honour the Social Services Committee on the completion of the distribution of aid to the needy during Ramadan in 1987.
14. The Committee continued to supervise the Society's Library by providing it with books. The Committee also appointed a number of members to follow up interest and file preparations for the books available.
15. The Committee participated in welcoming the visiting delegation from the Friends of the Blind Society.

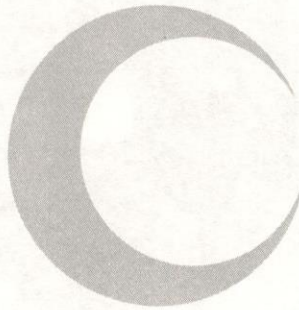

WOMEN ACTIVITIES COMMITTEE

The Committee carries out many activities related to women's activities within the Society. It is the only women committee of the Society unlike other committees whose members consist of both sexes.

- The Committee Chairwoman participated in the meetings of the Women Work Co-ordination Committee in the Gulf and Arabian Peninsula.
- The Committee also organised the Family Day for Tailoring Centres in Manama and Muharraq at the Society's Headquarters.
- The Committee organised a number of visits to the Elderly Home in Muharraq on Family Day.
- The Committee produced handicrafts and works of art for sale during various events to boost the Society's revenues and enable it to carry out its various activities.
- The Committee members visited Al Areen Wildlife Park and participated in the get-together held in Ramadan and the inauguration of the Society's Headquarters. The Committee is considered as a mirror that reflects women's activities in the Society.



SOCIAL SERVICES COMMITTEE

First : Study of Family Cases and Committee's Activities :

The Society's Social Services Committee continues to study the cases of needy families that approach the Society seeking assistance, whether in kind assistance or by adding their names to the Society's lists of families which receive regular and fixed monthly aid and whose number is 300, now that the conditions of a number of families have improved. The Committee also gives other assistance to needy families, such as emergency assistance at times of disasters such as fires or when glasses are to be provided as recommended to the Society by the Summaniya Medical Centre, in addition to assistance given to needy families by providing patients with false teeth and such other devices.

Second : Periodical Assistance

1. Ramadan Aid :

Total contributions received by the Society from donors for the Holy Month of Ramadan 1407 H-1987 AD amounted to BD 48,435.428 of which BD 44,000.000 was distributed to needy families registered with the Society all over Bahrain, befitting 2,430 families.

2. Uniforms for School Children 0

At the beginning of the new school year 1987 / 88 the Committee, as usual, allocated BD 4,566.000 to buy 230 rolls of material for school uniforms which were distributed to needy school children through school administrations, benefitting 66 schools of various stages.

3. School Notebooks :

At the beginning of the new school year the Committee purchased school notebooks by allocating BD 2,150 for this purpose. The notebooks were delivered to the pupils of poor families attending various school levels.

4. Emergency Cases :

The Committee responded, throughout the year, to calls for emergency aid of a number of families, whether those who were afflicted by fires breaking out at their homes or due to their social circumstances. In each of these cases, the Committee extended immediate aid and this scheme benefitted a number of families as follows :

- BD 100.00 for the family of Salem Juma Radhi, of Muharraq, following fire accident that broke out at his home and destroyed all his furnitue.
- BD 150.000 assistance to the fmaily of saeed Mohamed Yousuf of Al Bilad Al Qadim following a fire that broke out at his home.
- BD 75.000 assisting to the Family of Ali Jabara Rashid of East Riffa following a fire that broke out at his home.
- BD 100.000 assistance to Ali Hasan Ali Al Jardabi following a fire incident at his home.
- BD 100.00 assistance to the family of Mohamed Rashid Habib of Diraz to make up for the damages he suffered following a fire that broke out at his home.
- BD 150.000 assistance to the family of Ali Mohamed Isa Adam of Bani Jamra following fire at his home.

5. Eye Glasses :

Throughout the year, the Committee gave assistance to needy family transferred from salmaniya Medical Centre – the Ohthalmology Department by buying eye glasses for them. The number of patients who benefitted from this scheme were 119, and the amount of BD 880 was involved in it during 1987, in addition to the Committee's assistance to a number of individuals by providing them with contact lenses.

6. Artificial Teeth :

After studying the cases of a number of families, the Committee gave assistance to them in providing them with artificial teeth, due to their poverty. The following families received assistance as part of this scheme :

- BD 50.000 assistance to Madina Ashoor Ahmed, or Ras Rumman, in fixing lower dentures for her. Last year, the Committee bought complete dentures for her, but after they became loose, the Committee bought another set for her.

BD 100.000 The Committee purchased dentures for Ali Habib Mahdi, of Karbabad, because he could not afford to buy them although he badly needed the facility.

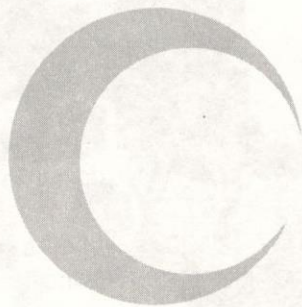
BD 100.000 Assistance to Khalil Ibrahim in buying dentures for him, because he was very poor.

7. Miscellaneous :

Throughout the year, the Committee studied cases of the families which applied to the Society for assistance as emergency cases for which the Committee responded without any delay. The Committee borrowed wheel-chairs for a number of patients who frequented medical centres to receive treatment. It also distributed blankets to needy families in winter which were donated by a number of benevolent traders to the Society for this purpose. The Committee, in addition, provided the Psychiatric Hospital with cakes and sweets for its patients every month throughout the year.

8. Other Activities During 1987 :

1. Participation in the inauguration of the Society's new Headquarters.
2. The Committee participated in the Family Day by visiting the Home for the Elderly.



HEALTH AWARENESS PROMOTION COMMITTEE

The Committee's activities during 1987 were as follows :

The Committee's activities during 1987 were as follows :

1. Organising 17 visits to hospitals, the Geriatric Home, children's wards and the Blind Friendship Society.
2. Paying 9 visits to villages to launch health awareness promotion campaigns.
3. Delivering 19 health lectures by its members.
3. Delivering 19 health lectures by its members.
4. Members took part in the workshops of the Ministry of Education and the College of Health Sciences (Anti-dehydration campaigns- Antenatal care- Breast feeding).
5. A mini-exhibition was held at the Conference Room during the inauguration of the Society's Headquarters by H.H. the Amir.
6. The Committee, together with other committees, participated in various activities, such as visits and private meetings.
7. The Committee participated in the World Health Day and the Family Day.
8. The Committee participated in the celebrations of Eid occasions and other events by organising visits to patients at local hospitals.

FIRST AID COMMITTEE

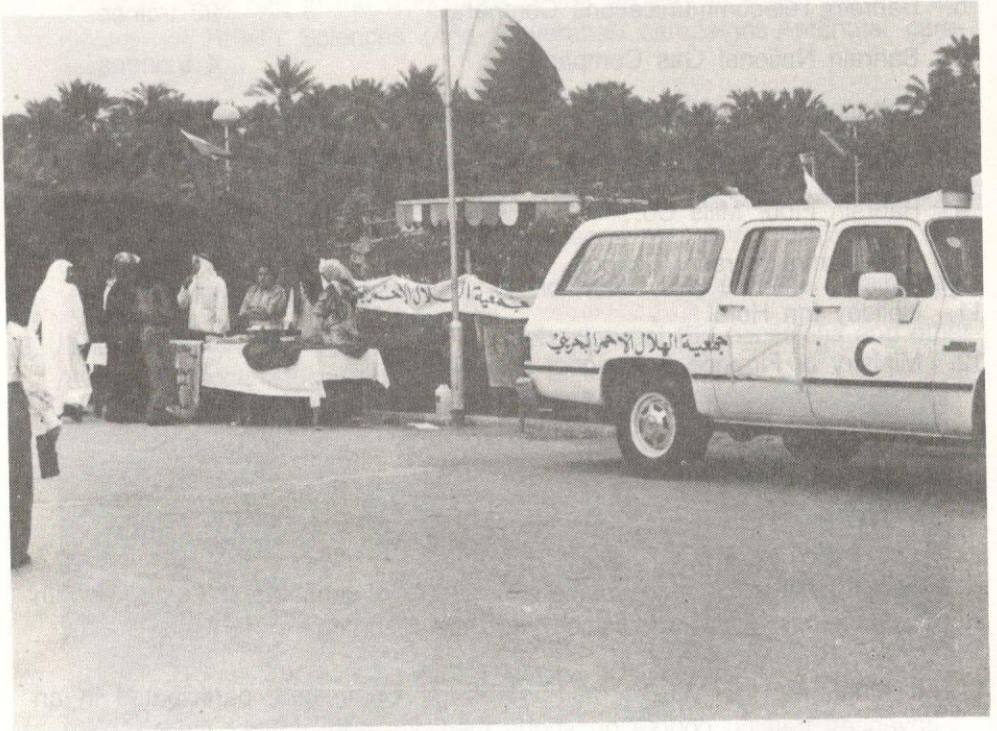

5. Mr Ali Qutub, Mr Asghar Khushaie, Mr Abbas Al Ghawwas and Mr Reza Ali Abdulla participated in a training course on emergency cases at Salmaniya Medical Centre under the supervision of consultant doctors between 14th November 1987 and 19th January 1988.

TAILORING AND SEWING TRAINING CENTRES IN MANAMA AND ISA TOWN

As usual every year, we present to our Society the Annual Report in which we summarise our activities and requirements. It is noticed that our activities are continuing smoothly, and we hold fairs and functions on public and national occasions. As for our requirements, they are being met piecemeal. Every year one idea or two are carried out at the centres from those ideas which we include in our Annual Report for 1985 - 1986 have been carried out amending the forms of graduation certificates by indicating the grades in them to assure the graduate of her future and the second proposal is increasing financial allocations to buy cloth and those needed for miscellaneous items. This was an impetus and motive for us in our activities.

1. On the inauguration of the Society's Headquarters, the Tailoring and sewing Training Centre in Manama held an exhibition for the trainees' products at the Headquarters. We were so pleased when H.H. the Amir and H.E. the Prime Minister issued instructions and expressed support for such charitable and educational activities. This noble gesture left a great impression on us.
2. On 21st March 1987, the Society's Tailoring and Sewing Training Centres held an exhibition for the trainees' products at the Water Gardens the proceeds from which totalled Bahrain Dinars One Hundred and fifty two (BD.152.000).
4. The number of trainees at the Tailoring and sewing Training Centre in Manama in the 15th batch for 1987 totalled 50. There were 16 drop-outs while 34 trainees graduated.
5. The number of trainees at the Tailoring and Sewing Training Centre at Isa Town in the 5th batch for 1986/1987 was 53. There were 18 drop-outs while 35 trainees graduated.

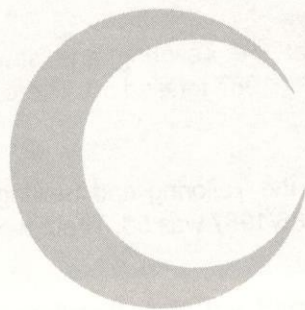
TAILORING AND SEWING TRAINING CENTRE IN MUHARRAQ

The Fifth Course at the Tailoring Centre in Muharraq (evening classes) began in October 1986. A total of 86 students were registered. The Course ended in May 1987 and 60 trainees graduated. Out of this total number, some 26 trainees dropped out.

This year marked a relative improvement in the Centre's activities and there was an increasing interest in the Centre from the trainees. Another Centre was opened at Bahrain Club, Muharraq (Morning classes) in November 1986. Thirty four trainees were admitted and 21 of them graduated. Out of this number, there were 13 drop-outs who were forced to leave their classes for personal reasons.

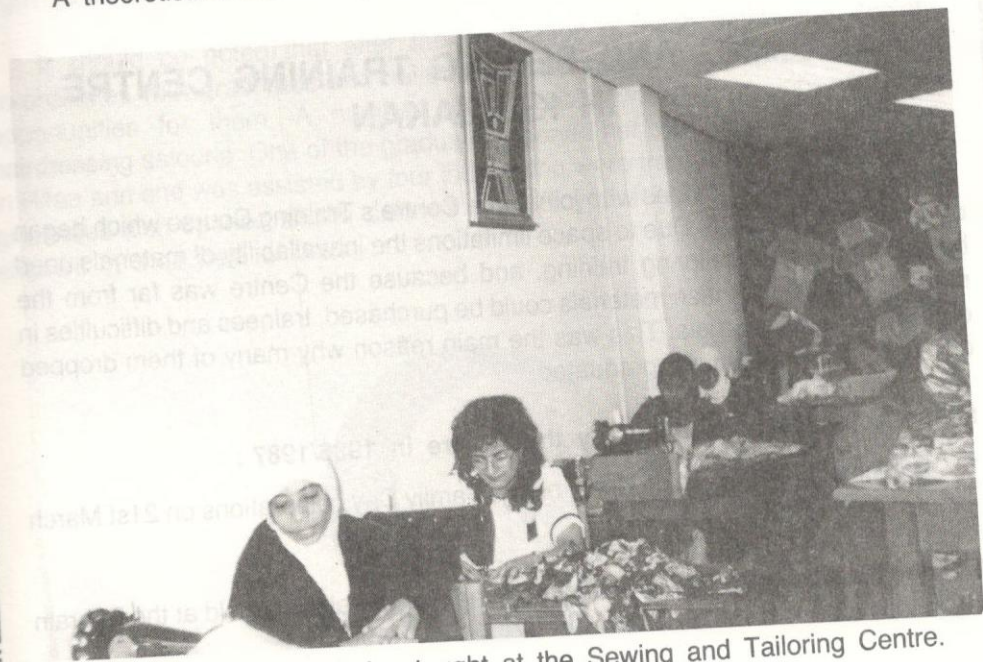
Major Activities carried out by the Tailoring Centre in Muharraq :

TAILORING AND SEWING TRAINING CENTRE IN DAIH

The Fourth Course began in October 1986 and the number of trainees were 40. The Course ended in May 1987. Thirty four trainees graduated and there were six drop-outs.

Major Activities carried out by the Centre in 1986/87 :

1. Participating in the sale of the Centre's products on the Family Day on 21st March 1987.
2. Participating in the 2nd Arabian Gulf Week for social Work held between 23rd to 27th March 1987.

TAILORING AND SEWING TRAINING CENTRE IN KARZAKAN

The number of trainees who joined the Centre's Training Course which began on 1st October was 30. Due to space limitations the inavailability of materials need by the trainees for tailoring training, and because the Centre was far from the markets from which these materials could be purchased, trainees and difficulties in obtaining these materials. This was the main reason why many of them dropped out. Twenty two trainees graduated.

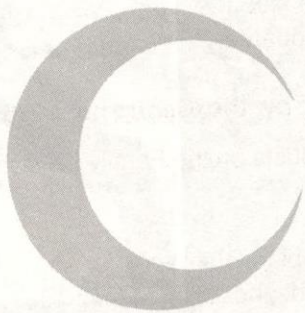
Major Activities carried out by the Centre in 1986/1987 :

HAIRDRESSING AND BEAUTY CARE CENTRE

Trainees for the Hair Dressing and Beauty Care Centre's Eighth Course registered their names for the year 1986/1987. The number of trainees at the old headquarters were 43. Two months after the Course began, the Centre moved to its new permanent premises which were especially designed for this purpose by the Society and was provided with the most advanced equipment purchased from Lebanon. Studies resumed at the new premises and continued for 9 months, during which the trainees were given theoretical and practical lessons. After that, the trainees were sent for practical training at the hairdressing saloons which co-operate with the Society in order to familiarise them with work at hairdressing saloons and to improve their skills in this field. They were also sent to be trained on how to deal with customers. Before the Course ended, the trainees sat for a theoretical and practical examination supervised by a number of experts from hairdressing saloons in Bahrain. The number of trainees who graduated in the eight batch were 38 and there were five drop-outs.

It should be noted that after the graduation of each batch, the Society co-ordinates with graduates and hairdressing saloons in Bahrain to provide job opportunities for them. A number of graduates were given jobs at local hairdressing saloons. One of the graduates opened her own hair-dressing saloon in Rifaa and she was assisted by four ladies who were trained at the saloon. Two graduates also opened similar saloons in Isa Town. The graduates were highly efficient in their field of work.

THE MANAMA NURSERY SCHOOL

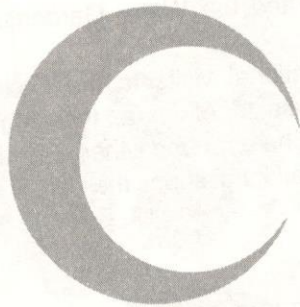
The Bahrain Red Crescent society opened the Manama Nursery School in 1975. The premises, which were owned by the Ministry of Health, were situated near the Public Security Headquarters on Shaikh Sulman Road. There were three classes accommodating 60 children and the teaching staff consisted of the headmistress, assistant headmistress, three teachers and four cleaning workers.

In 1985, the Nursery School moved to its new premises which were donated by the Ministry of Labour and Social Affairs and were administered by the Bahrain Red Crescent Society. The new headquarters are situated behind the Juffair Dome. They are ideal in terms of construction, modern teaching facilities, furniture, sophisticated educational aids and a library containing children's books. The Nursery School's teaching staff consists of the headmistress, assistant headmistress and eight teachers. The total number of workers is 6. The Society has increased the salaries of the Nursery School's teachers and workers and covered them by the social Insurance Scheme which applies to all government and company employees.

Major Activities Carried out by Manama Nursery School in 1986/87 :

1. The children participated in a number of activities, like competitions and songs on National Day, Family Day, Health Week, Traffic Week, Eid Al Fitr and the Prophet's Birthday.
2. The children participated in the Children's Art Exhibition organised by the Ministry of Education.
3. The children participated in a Traffic Parade organised by the Road Safety Committee at Isa Town Stadium.
4. The children participated in the concert held on the 2nd Arabian Gulf Week for Social Work at the Diploma Hotel.
5. The Nursery School organised a number of outings and visits to public gardens such as Adhari Park, the Water Gardens and Bushiri Bowling.

6. The Nursery School organised an open day for the children's parents to get them acquainted with children's activities.
7. The children visited the Coastguards, and the Fire Brigade, at Mina Sulman. The visits were organised by the Public Relations Department at the Ministry of the Interior.
8. All the Nursery School's teaching staff participated in a number of training courses organised by the Directorate of Training at the Ministry of Education.
9. The children participated in the reception held on the inauguration of the new headquarters of the Bahrain Red Crescent Society.

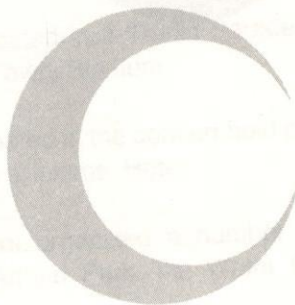


THE BUDAIYA NURSERY SCHOOL

The Budaiya Nursery School, which was established in 1979, is now attended by 80 children. It is administered by a headmistress, four teachers and three workers. It admits children from 3 to 6 years old.

Major Activities carried out by the Budaiya Nursery School in 1987 :

1. The children participated in various activities on the Arab Child Day, Bahrain National Day, Family Day, Health Week, Traffic Week, Garga'ourn, Eid Al Fitr, and on birthday parties of some of the children.
2. Fourteen children participated in the Children's Art Exhibition organised by the Ministry of Education.
3. The children paid, in co-ordination with the Ministry of the Interior, a number of familiarisation visits to the Coastguards in Muharraq, the Budaiya Fire Brigade, Mounted Police and the Brass Band Section.
4. The children also paid recreational visits to the Busaibih Beach, the Traffic Nursery at Adhari Park and the Water Gardens.
5. The children paid educational visits to the Pottery Centre in A'ali, Mina Sulman, Shaikh Isa House in Al-Jasra, the Central Market, Adhari Park, Qassari Park and Umm Shu'oom and other visits in their area, like the Post Office, the baker's, the tailoring shop, the carpenter's shop and the sweet shop.

PARTICIPATION IN THE 18th CONFERENCE OF THE ARAB RED CRESCENT AND RED CROSS SOCIETIES :

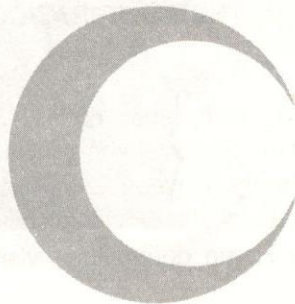

It also participated in the festivals held at nursery schools.

SOCIETY PARTICIPATES IN THE CELEBRATIONS OF THE 2nd ARABIAN WEEK FOR SOCIAL WORK

The Society participated with other private Societies in Bahrain in the celebrations of the 2nd Arabian Gulf Week for Social Work which Bahrain hosted at the Bahrain Exhibitions Centre between 22nd and 27th March 1987 by holding an exhibition for the products of the Society's tailoring centres.

H.H. THE AMIR SPONSORS THE INAUGURATION OF THE SOCIETY'S NEW PREMISES

H.H. The Amir, Shaikh Isa Bin Sulman Al-Khalifa, the Society's Honorary President, sponsored the inauguration of the Society's new headquarters on Monday 23rd November 1987. The Amir was accompanied by H.E. the Prime Minister, Shaikh Khalifa Bin Sulman Al-Khalifa, Ministers, Ministry Under-Secretaries, Members of the Diplomatic Corps, dignitaries and a large number of invited guests.

The Amir expressed pride of the Society's humanitarian deeds and efforts since it was established in 1970 and of its social services and vocational training programmes. He pledged continued support and encouragement for its various humanitarian activities.

THE SOCIETY DISTRIBUTES MATERIAL ASSISTANCE TO NEEDY FAMILIES IN BAHRAIN'S TOWN AND VILLAGES

The total amount of contribution received from donors for the Holy Month of Ramadan 1407 H – 1987 was BD.48,435.428 of which BD.44,000.000 was distributed to needy families registered with the Society in towns and villages, thus benefitting 2,430 families.

THE SOCIETY DISTRIBUTES SCHOOL NOTEBOOKS AND UNIFORMS TO SCHOOL CHILDREN

As usual every year, the Society purchased school notebooks and uniforms for distribution to school children of needy families at various schools of the Ministry of Education. The amount spent on buying school notebooks was BD.2,150.000 and another BD.4,566.000 was spent on school uniforms by buying 230 rolls of cloth. The scheme benefitted a large number of school children.

SOCIETY'S PUBLIC RELATION COMMITTEE CONTINUES DISTRIBUTION OF FINANCIAL AND IN KIND ASSISTANCE TO NEEDY FAMILIES

The Society's Public Relations Committee continues to study the cases of newly registered needy families in an attempt to extend in kind assistance to them or add them to the list of those needy families already registered with it who receive regular monthly assistance and who total 300, as the cases of some of them have improved. It also continues to extend other assistance to families in need, such as emergency cases like victims of fires or to buy eye glasses for those referred to it by the Salmaniya Medical Centre. The Society also continues to offer assistance to poor families needing artificial teeth and dentures.

Mr. Mohamed Abdul Rasool Al Khayyat represented the Society at the Road Safety Committee which supervises preparations for the GCC Traffic Week. The Society's Nursery Schools in Manama and Budaiya also took part in the Gulf Road Safety Week.

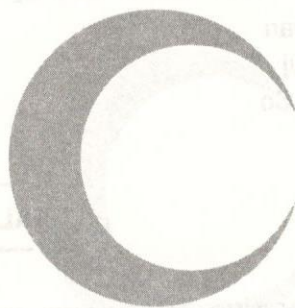
